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# Minimum wage update – Guernsey and Jersey

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Both Jersey and Guernsey have recently announced increases to minimum wage. Determining an appropriate minimum wage remains a challenge for both Islands with many often critical that the agreed rates do not go far enough and some that they go too far.

Neither Island has yet recognised the concept of a 'living wage' but with the UK adopting a 'national living wage' (which is, in fact, a premium minimum wage for over-25s only and not a living wage at all!) there has been pressure on both Islands to increase their minimum wages in line with this premium minimum wage. The increases in minimum wage for both Islands in 2017 represent positive increases. The Jersey rise reflects a 3 per cent increase in the minimum wage which is the largest percentage increase since 2008 and exceeds the latest increases in both average earnings and the cost of living.

In Jersey this year, a question has been asked of the Attorney General in relation to whether it would be possible to set different minimum wage levels across the various sectors in the Island. Whilst the Attorney General did not believe that setting different minimum wage levels for different industries or seasonal workers raised a human rights issue, he did suggest that this difference may conflict with the Discrimination (Jersey) Law 2013. The risk being that a difference in treatment may be indirectly discriminatory if the effect of setting different rates of pay was disproportionately prejudicial to people with a particular protected characteristic.

We've set out below the minimum wage rates that are due to come into effect in 2017. Note, however, that in Jersey, Deputy Sam Mezec has lodged a proposition to take steps to increase the agreed minimum wage to £7.20 per hour. That proposition is due to be debated by the States on 29 November 2016. The recommendations of the Minister for Social Security in relation to accommodation and food offsets will also be debated that day. We will keep you updated on the position in Jersey.
